Para 7.4

Will you look at how much money my parents have when you decide whether to give me civil legal aid?

Yes, in most cases we must do so. We will only do this if:

- Your Mum and / or Dad are not on the other side, in the case for which you need legal aid
- You are aware of where your Mum and / or Dad are living and you have an ongoing relationship with them
- You are in full-time education, are in an apprenticeship or are doing vocational training
- It would not be unfair for us to do so.

We also need to look at any money or property you yourself have. We may have to refuse you legal aid if you and / or your parents have a lot of money or property. Or we may have to get you and / or your parents to pay something towards the legal aid.

Para 7.5

The first two lines and bullet point should read as follows:

Civil legal aid is not always free. Sometimes you may have to pay some or all of the costs of your case:

- If you or your Mum and / or Dad have a lot of money or property and we decide their money or property must be included with yours - you may have to pay us a contribution towards the cost of your legal aid. Your solicitor can explain this when you first contact them about your case. If you do have to pay us a contribution, we will tell you when we grant your legal aid.
